LSUIC EXTENDS WARM RAMADAN GREETINGS TO ALL MUSLIM SCHOLARS



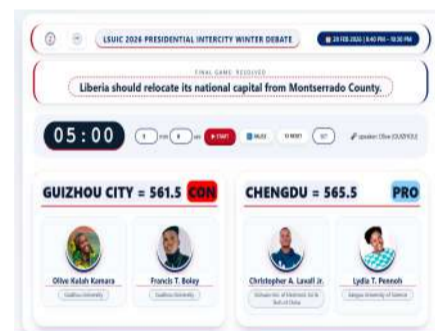

LSUIC CELEBRATES RECORD-BREAKING PRESIDENTIAL INTERCITY WINTER DEBATE

The National Executive Committee (NEC) has extended heartfelt gratitude to all Scholars following the resounding success of the LSUIC 2026 Presidential Intercity Winter Debate (February 28, 2026). In a New Month message, National President Olano Teah Bloh praised the Academic Excellence Committee (AEC), headed by Dr. Christian Mulbah and Hon. Queenetta D. Johnson, for their vibrancy and rapid growth under this leadership. Special recognition was given to the 13 Judges, headed by Hon. Marcus Sepo Jensen, whose passion and sacrifice were evident throughout the competition. Participating cities and debaters were commended for inspiring the Union and embodying the motto, "Excellence Through Hard Work."

Chengdu City claimed first place, followed by Guizhou in second and Xuzhou in third. Hon. Prince Y. Saydee of Xuzhou was named overall MVP for his outstanding performance. Prize distribution included 900 RMB for Chengdu, 550 RMB for Guizhou, and 350 RMB for Xuzhou. MVP Saydee received 100 RMB, while additional Hongbao were distributed to debaters and scholars across LSUIC platforms. The NEC extended appreciation to sponsors Hon. D. Omario Yarsiah (600 RMB) and Hon. Jenneh Bonah (350 RMB) for their generosity. Hon. Enoch Keateh Dongbo was recognized for modifying the judges' scoring system, and Hon. Jenkins G. Wilson for graphical designs. All participants have received certificates.

NP BLOH APPOINTS NEW MEMBER TO CONSTITUTION REVIEW COMMITTEE



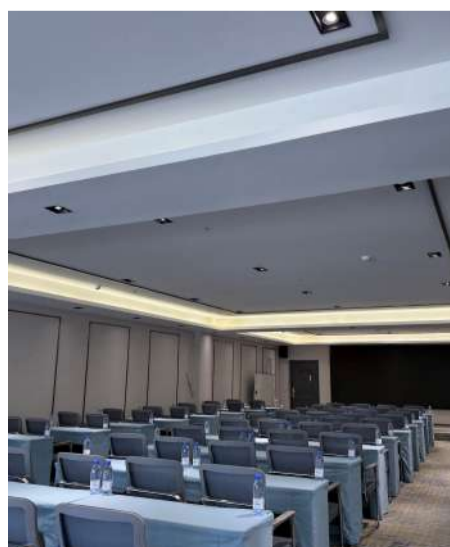
Pursuant to Article 14 (1)(e) and Article 29 (1) of the 2020 Amended LSUIC Constitution, and in accordance with the authority vested in the National President, Scholar. Mohammed Daouda Keita, has been appointed to the Constitution Review Committee (CRC), pending

confirmation by the Council of Coordinators. Mr. Keita, a student at the University of South China, Hengyang City, Hunan Province joins the team tasked with amending the LSUIC Constitution this fiscal year. This came right after the NEC meeting with the CRC on February 19, 2026.

THE NEC AND JULS CONDUCTED A FEASIBILITY STUDY

In preparation for the Union's 20th anniversary and the 20th General Conference, the National Executive Committee (NEC) and the leadership of the Jinan Union of Liberia Students (JULS) conducted a comprehensive feasibility study. The collaborative effort aims to assess logistical requirements, resource availability, and host city capacity ahead of the momentous event. By evaluating potential venues, accommodation, and

transportation options in Jinan, both teams seek to ensure a seamless celebration that honors two decades of unity. The study will also explore programs that reflects on the Union's history while planning for its future. Preliminary findings will guide the NEC decisions regarding appointments, budget allocation and scheduling. This collaboration underscores the importance of chapter-level involvement in national events.

The CRC Targets April as Completion Deadline for LSUIC New Constitution.

On February 19, 2026, the NEC met with the Constitution Review Committee (CRC) to accelerate the finalization of the governing document of the Union. After the meeting, the Chairman, Hon. Joshua Bosco Barvor provided feedback; that the CRC will complete the work by April, and take suggestions and review requests from members of the Union during the month of May, then June for the final release.

NEC BOOSTS DIGITAL PRESENCE WITH 44 VIDEOS AND GROWING FOLLOWERS

The National Executive Committee (NEC) has significantly strengthened the Union's digital footprint since taking office. A total of forty-four videos have been uploaded to the LSUIC YouTube Channel, showcasing events, leadership messages, and academic activities to engage members across China. Simultaneously, the Union's Facebook presence has experienced remarkable growth, now boasting 4,066 followers. This represents an in-

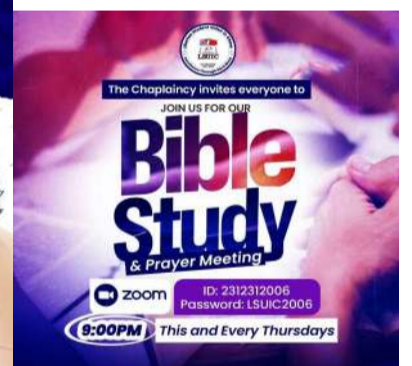
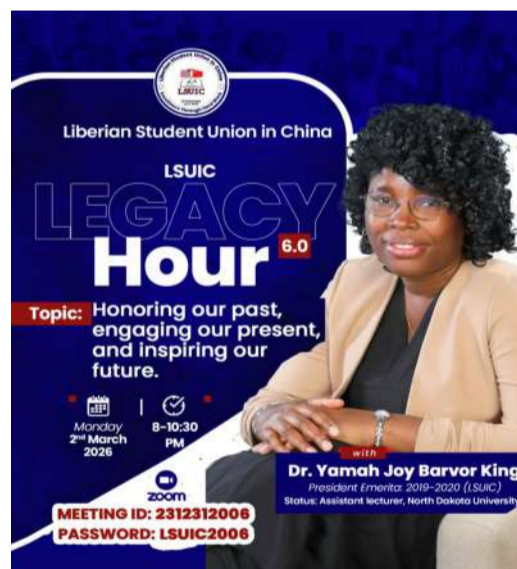

LEGACY HOUR 6.0 WITH DR. KING: LESSONS IN LEADERSHIP, AND LEADING THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

The sixth edition of the Legacy Hour featured Dr. Yamah Joy Barvor King, who reflected on her tenure as President Emerita of LSUIC (2019-2020). Now an Assistant Lecturer at North Dakota University, Dr. King detailed the challenges of leading during the COVID-19 crisis. She explained how she worked alongside the embassy and donors to secure vital support for students facing hardship. Beyond crisis management, Dr. King emphasized that true leadership requires

empathy, active listening, and decisiveness. She urged attendees to prioritize preparing future leaders and fostering collaboration. During her term, she established digital membership records and a scholarship committee, ensuring a lasting legacy. The session concluded with an interactive dialogue. When asked about balance, Dr. King advised leaders to maintain clear boundaries and practice self-care, enabling them to serve their constituents with genuine empathy and resilience.
