NATIONAL PRESIDENT BLOH SET TO APPOINT CONFERENCE COMMITTEE, AND THE IEC

The National Executive Committee (NEC), through the Office of the National President, Hon. Olano Teah Bloh, announces the impending appointment of two constitutionally mandated committees in early April 2026. In strict adherence to the LSUIC Constitution, the Independent Elections Commission (IEC) will be appointed per Article 23, Section 4-k-ii, no sooner than ninety and no later than sixty days prior to the General Con-

ference. Simultaneously, the Conference Committee will be appointed pursuant to Article 11, Section 9, requiring formation at least three months prior to the conference. These strategic appointments reflect the administration's steadfast commitment to transparency, credible elections, and strengthened governance as the Union approaches its historic 20th Anniversary. Members are urged to remain engaged.

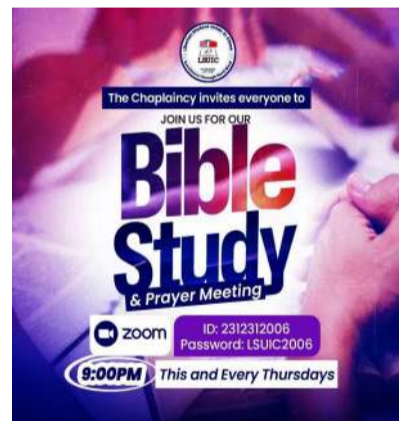

The Office of the National Vice President of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC), H.E. Hon. Ruphine M. Harmon, has issued a crucial reminder for all scholars to review the expiration dates of their visas, residence permits, and passports. In a recent advisory, Hon. Harmon emphasized that immigration laws and regulations are strict and non-negotiable, and any oversight could result in serious consequences for students. Scholars are strongly encouraged to proactively monitor their documents, ensuring timely renewals and avoiding unnecessary legal or travel complications. "This is a mat-

ter of personal responsibility and compliance. Staying informed about your document expiration dates protects you from avoidable challenges and ensures uninterrupted study and residency in China," the National Vice President noted. The NEC urges all members to treat this reminder with utmost seriousness and take immediate action if their visas, permits, or passports are nearing expiration. Timely attention now safeguards academic focus and residency stability for all scholars. It is our hope that all scholars within the parameters of LSUIC and China at large will remain law-abiding, she said.
