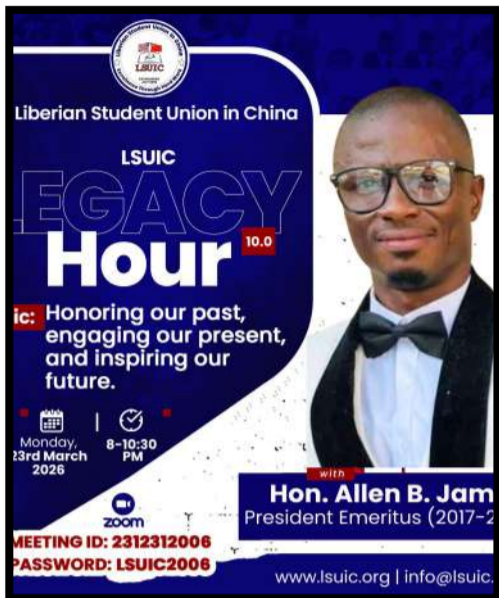

HON. JAMES REFLECTS ON CRISIS MANAGEMENT, CONTROVERSIAL, AND LEADERSHIP LESSONS



This was the 10th edition of the Legacy Hour, a series honoring past leaders of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC), featuring President Emeritus Alan B. James, who served as president from 2017 to 2018. James shared his administration's achievements, including providing financial aid to non-bilateral students, hosting a mini-conference in Beijing, and managing a crisis involving stranded students. He discussed the challenges faced during his tenure, including communication gaps, financial constraints,

and cultural barriers, while highlighting lessons learned about leadership, negotiation, and crisis management. The session included a Q&A portion where Hon. James addressed questions about the mini-conference funding issues and his decision-making processes, particularly regarding the controversial decision to change the conference venue from Xuzhou to Beijing despite opposition. The conversation ended with remarks from current leadership expressing appreciation for James's service and the value of learning from past experiences.

LIBERIA MY HERITAGE FOUNDER ELFREDA N.T JACKSON TO SHARE ON LSUIC LEGACY HOUR 11.0

LSUIC will feature Madam Elfreda Norma Tomah Jackson as the guest for the 11th edition of its Legacy Hour Series on Monday, March 30, 2026. Madam Jackson is the founder of "Liberia-My-Heritage, Inc.", a Massachusetts-based nonprofit established in 2025. She is a medical scientist, an entrepreneur, and a mother. Madam Jackson's work is driven by her deep faith and passion for community empowerment. Through her initiative, she aims to inspire younger generations to embrace their Libe-

rian identity. She is being featured as a guest because her mission aligns with our Union objectives (as stated in Article 8 of the 2020 amended constitution of LSUIC). Her organization is dedicated to preserving Liberian culture through education, community engagement, and storytelling, with a specific focus on connecting youth in the diaspora to their roots. To further this mission, her organization hosts an annual Liberian-Fest and recently launched online seminars to expand its reach.

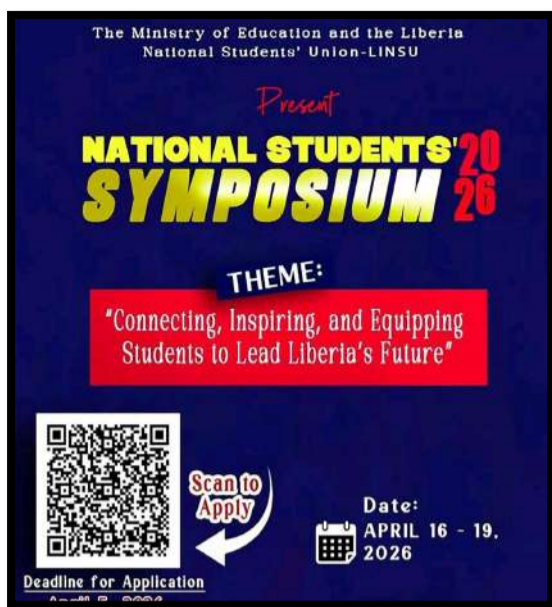

NATIONAL PRESIDENT BLOH APPLAUDS GOVERNMENT'S (MOE) NATIONAL STUDENT SYMPOSIUM



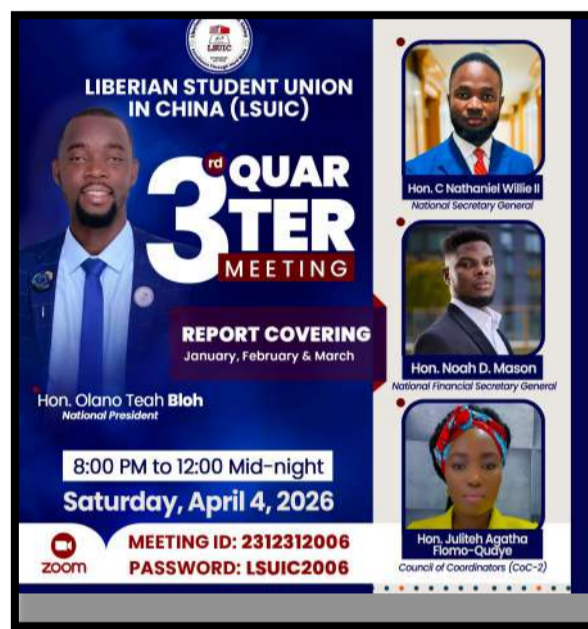
His Excellency Olano Teah Bloh, National President of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC), has issued a press statement commending the Government of Liberia, through the Ministry of Education, for organizing the National Student Symposium 2026. Scheduled for April 16–19, 2026, in Monrovia, the symposium will convene over 300 student leaders from all 15 counties under the theme, "Connecting, Inspiring, and Equipping Students to Lead Liberia's

Future." Hosted in partnership with the Liberia National Students Union (LINSU), the event features keynote sessions, workshops, and student showcases in poetry, arts, and technology. President Bloh emphasized that youth development is both an economic and political imperative for a nation with a predominantly young population. He called on all eligible students to apply by the April 5 deadline, urging them to seize this opportunity to help build Liberia's future.

LSUIC TO CONVENE THIRD QUARTERLY GENERAL MEETING

The Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) wishes to inform all members that the Third Quarterly General Meeting for the 2025-2026 fiscal year will be held on Saturday, April 4, 2026. Pursuant to Article 9d(1) of the 2020 Amended LSUIC Constitution, general meetings with all members are held quarterly as determined by the National Executive Committee. This gathering serves as a vital platform for the membership to engage directly with the Union's leadership on matters affecting our welfare and academic pursuits. The meeting will fea-

AEC DELIVERS IMPACTFUL QUARTERLY PROGRAMS, ACHIEVES 70% OF ANNUAL WORK PLAN

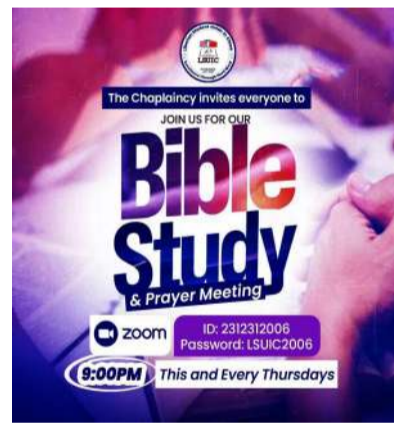


DR. C. MULBAH — AEC CHAIR

The Academic Excellence Committee (AEC), chaired by Dr. Christian Mulbah, has recorded significant progress, completing 70% of its fiscal year work plan with consistent monthly programming throughout the third quarter. Since January, the committee has executed four impactful sessions. On January 17, scholars gathered for "How to Secure Scholarships and Summer Internships," followed on January 27 by "Entrepreneurship & Start-Up Strategies: From Idea to Venture." February fea-

tured the Presidential Intercity Winter Debate 2026, a two-week competition held from February 13–28. Most recently, on March 28, the AEC hosted "Thesis Writing: Everything You Need to Know," equipping graduate scholars with essential research and writing skills. Under Dr. Mulbah's leadership, the AEC continues to fulfill its mandate of fostering academic excellence and professional development. Scholars are encouraged to stay engaged as the committee prepares to launch its remaining initiatives before year-end.
