LSUIC ANNOUNCES THE FIRST-EVER HOMECOMING TO MARK 20 YEARS OF EXCELLENCE



The NEC of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) has officially announced the first-ever Homecoming event. A landmark celebration set to reunite generations of Liberian scholars and leaders in and out of China. Scheduled for Saturday, April 25 at 8:00 PM Beijing time (12:00 Noon Monrovia time), the virtual gathering will take place via the LSUIC Zoom Platform. Described by the leadership as “a historic return,” the event commemorates LSUIC’s 20th anniversary, highlighting two decades of unity, academic excellence, and community impact. The National Executive

Committee (NEC) is calling on veterans, current members, affiliates, and past leaders to reconnect and celebrate the union’s enduring legacy. Under the theme, “Honoring Our Past, Engaging Our Present, and Inspiring Our Future,” the Homecoming will feature dialogue, mentorship, panel discussions, and fundraising activities aimed at strengthening the organization’s future. The leadership additionally emphasize that the event is more than a celebration, it is a powerful moment of reflection and renewal, bringing together pioneers and present torchbearers to shape the next chapter of LSUIC’s journey.

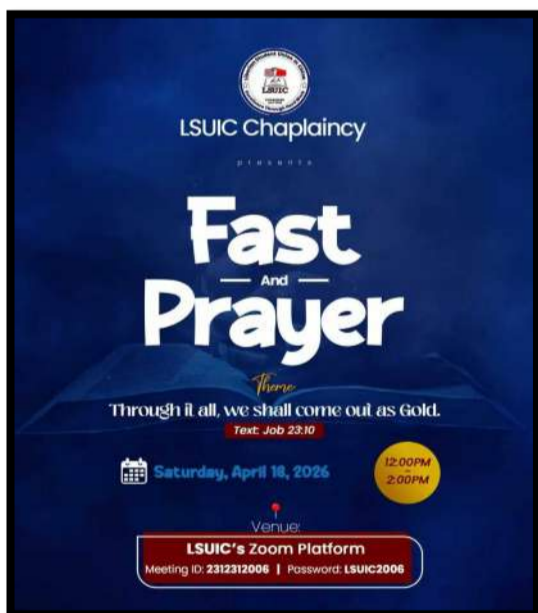
THE CRC INTENSIFIES CONSTITUTIONAL REFORM DRIVE

The Constitutional Review Committee of the LSUIC has renewed its call for active participation in the ongoing constitutional review, urging scholars to submit suggestions and amendments as the process enters its final phase. The Constitution Review Committee (CRC) emphasized that contributions from the general student body remain critical as it works to conclude the first draft of the review before the end of the month. According to the committee, the exercise is designed to strengthen LSUIC’s governance framework by

addressing gaps, clarifying ambiguities, and incorporating progressive ideas that reflect the evolving needs of its members. Students and affiliates are encouraged to provide clear proposals, revised provisions, and well-justified rationales to support their submissions. The CRC noted that this inclusive approach ensures that the revised constitution reflects collective ownership and promotes transparency, accountability, and institutional growth. Submissions can be made by scanning the official QR code provided by the committee.



THE LSUIC CHAPLAINCY LEADS NATIONWIDE FAST AND PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL RENEWAL



The National Chaplaincy of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) successfully convened a National Fast and Prayer Day held on April 18, 2026, bringing together scholars across various cities in a unified spiritual exercise aimed at strengthening faith and renewing purpose. THE COUNTDOWN TO JINAN 2026 HAS BEGUN WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF THE CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

The NEC has announced the appointment of the 20th Annual General Conference Committee, marking a significant step toward hosting the landmark event in Jinan City, Shandong Province, by July 2026. The appointment, made by National President His Excellency Mr. Olano Teah Bloh on April 6, 2026, places Scholar Enoch Kwateh Dongbo at the helm as Chairman, supported by a dynamic team of student leaders tasked with delivering a successful conference.

Described as a strategic move toward excellence and transformation, the committee will oversee planning, logistics, budgeting, and overall program execution for the Union’s highest decision-making assembly. Meanwhile, the confirmation process has already commenced at the level of the Council of Coordinators (CoC), in line with constitutional requirements. Upon final approval, the committee will be formally inducted to begin full scale operations. Congratulations with high anticipation.



A MOVE TO BUILD A CREDIBLE ELECTION; AS THE NATIONAL PRESIDENT APPOINTS THE IEC



The NEC has announced the appointment of its Independent Elections Commission (IEC), signaling a decisive step toward strengthening democratic governance and electoral integrity within the Union. The appointment, made on April 14, 2026, by National President His Excellency Mr. Olano Teah Bloh, empowers the Commission to oversee all aspects of the Union’s electoral process. The decision aligns with key provisions of the 2020 Amended LSUIC Constitution and underscores the commitment to transparency and accountability. Heading the Commission is

Mr. Aaron S. Pittman of the University of Science and Technology of China, supported by a team of experienced officers and commissioners drawn from various cities across China. The IEC is mandated to design electoral guidelines, supervise candidate eligibility, manage voting processes, resolve disputes, and certify election outcomes. Meanwhile, confirmation of the appointees is pending at the Council of Coordinators. LSUIC leadership is urging all members and stakeholders to cooperate fully in ensuring a credible, peaceful, and transparent election process.
