FOUNDING PRESIDENT, AND LIBERIA'S AGRICULTURE MINISTER HONORS LSUIC'S HOMECOMING

Hon. Dr. J. Alexander Nuetah, founding president of LSUIC and currently Liberia's Minister of Agriculture, delivered an emotional address during the LSUIC First-ever homecoming, recalling how the union was born from necessity in 2006, not from grand vision but from challenges over unpaid student allowances and a lack of support systems. He described traveling to the airport to receive a newly arrived student, an act of fellowship that eventually led to marriage. That story, he said, captures what LSUIC truly is: a community of care. Dr. Nuetah challenged

current scholars to transform Liberian society using their Chinese training, pointing to China's own development story as a model. "Be the example of developmental excellence," he urged. His presence, from founding student leader to cabinet minister, powerfully illustrated the union's role as a pipeline for national leadership. This "Fellowship & Allowance Era" established a culture of mutual support that persists as a pillar of the union today. By organizing to meet basic needs, the founders proved that collective action was the only path to individual success.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER DOC. AUGUSTINE BALLAH REDEFINES LOYALTY AS A CORNERSTONE FOR LSUIC

Delivering a powerful keynote address at LSUIC's 20th anniversary homecoming, Rev. Doc. His subject was loyalty, a word that sounds simple until one begins to excavate its layers. Doc. Ballah did exactly that, identifying four distinct types of loyalty that he said have shaped LSUIC's twenty-year history. Distinguishing between team loyalty, self-loyalty, relationship loyalty, and what he called "excellent loyalty," Doc. Ballah urged members to commit to the institution itself, not to individuals, friend-

ships, or personal gain. "Excellent loyalty is not loyalty to a person, nor to a team. It is loyalty to the institution and to what the institution stands for," he said. Doc. Ballah, a 15-year veteran of the LSUIC community and interim leader of the Liberian Association of Chinese Trained Scholars (LACTS), argued that this higher-level loyalty is essential for Liberian professionals returning home to serve in government, healthcare, and engineering. His remarks became the intellectual anchor of the evening.

Harmon, who served as master of ceremony, noted that the choir's birth reflects the current administration's creative ambition. These artistic moments, participants said, transformed what could have been a routine ceremonial gathering into an emotionally memorable celebration of community and belonging.

THE COUNCIL OF COORDINATORS CONFIRMS TWO KEY COMMITTEES FOR HISTORIC CONFERENCE



The Liberian Student Union in China’s Council of Coordinators (CoC) has officially confirmed the Conference Committee (CC) and the Independent Elections Commission (IEC), both of whom have taken the oath of office and are now ready to serve the union. The announcement marks a major step toward what promises to be a groundbreaking annual conference. The IEC is actively preparing for the union’s first-ever hybrid voting system, allowing all good-standing

members whether they attend the annual conference in person or not to participate in the upcoming elections. Meanwhile, the Conference Committee is including several events for this year’s conference, including the Miss LSUC pageant, a pool party, a digital registration system...etc. “These committees are committed to innovation and inclusion,” the NEC stated. With these developments, LSUC continues to push the boundaries of student engagement and institutional modernization.

THE COC HOSTS SUCCESSFUL VIRTUAL RETREAT FOCUSED ON PURPOSE AND UNITY

The Council of Coordinators (CoC) held its highly anticipated virtual retreat on April 17, 2026, a one-day, three-hour session spanning 8:30 PM to 11:30 PM China Time under the theme "Leading with Purpose, Building in Unity: Lead. Unite. Advance." The intensive retreat brought together coordinators from across China for an evening of reflection, strategy, and team bonding. Program highlights included a powerful reminder message delivered by Dr. Yamah J. B. King, a former LSUC president, who challenged participants

to lead with integrity and collective vision. The session also featured engaging debates that stimulated critical thinking and collaboration, alongside interactive games designed to foster team bonding and lighthearted competition. The CoC described the retreat as a resounding success, noting that it strengthened coordination among leaders. The event underscores the CoC’s commitment to building a more unified and purpose-driven leadership structure ahead of the union’s upcoming annual conference.

Regular services were held every Sunday in April. On April 5, Hon. Vampelt preached on

“Divine Substitution; An Entrance Into Internal Life” from Isaiah 53:1-11. April 12’s theme was “The Ways of Man That is Pleasant Unto the Will of God” from Genesis 8:21. On April 19, Brother Aloysius N. Sheriff spoke on “The Sphere of Grace” from 2nd-Timothy 1:9. April 26 featured Brother Amos M. Siryon on “Practical Means of Knowing God” using 1st-Corinthians 2:11-15. The National Fast and Prayer session drew from Job 23:10: “Through it all, we shall come out as Gold.” Total monthly offering collected was 179 RMB.
