President Boakai Calls for National Unity in Liberia’s Fight Against Cancer

Speaking at the Liberia Cancer Society Benefit Gala Dinner on May 14, 2026, President Joseph Nyuma Boakai, Sr., through Senior Advisor Dr. Augustine Konneh, described cancer as a growing national challenge requiring collective action and accountability. He emphasized early detection, affordable screening, and transparent healthcare costs while urging compassion, awareness, and stronger national support systems. The President reaffirmed government’s commitment to advancing prevention, quality care, and dignity for all Liberians affected by cancer.
