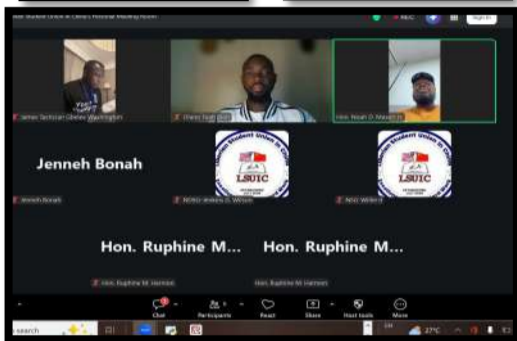

LSUIC AND LINSU AGREE ON MOU DURING HISTORIC VIRTUAL MEETING ON MAY 19, 2026



In a landmark virtual meeting on May 19, 2026, which served as an introduction and acquaintance session between the leadership of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) and the Liberian National Student Union (LINSU), both Unions have agreed to pursue a formal partnership aimed at broadening scholarship access and educational resources for students in both nations. LSUIC National President, Hon. Olano Teah Bloh, presented the union's achievements from Quarter 1 to present with a historical background of the Union, while

LINSU President Hon. James Washington, who was in China at the time for poverty alleviation seminars, expressed strong interest in collaboration to support Liberian students seeking overseas opportunities. Both leadership teams, including LSUIC's National Vice President Hon. Ruphine M. Harmon and National Secretary General Hon. Willie II, endorsed a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). A Joint online program is planned to share scholarship guidance and reintegration support for returning graduates from China.

LSUIC PRESIDENT PAYS COURTESY VISIT TO LIBERIAN EMBASSY IN BEIJING

On May 29, 2026, the National President of LSUIC, Hon. Olano Teah Bloh, paid a courtesy visit to the Liberian Embassy in Beijing to meet with H.E. Hon. Ambassador Dudley McKinley Thomas and his team of diplomats. The discussion centered not on protocol alone, but on the future of Liberian Students abroad, their welfare, their academic excellence, and the role they must play in rebuilding and representing our nation. That meeting was a quiet but firm reminder: diplo-

macy begins with its youngest citizens. The Ambassador expressed that it is always his desire to help LSUIC and all Liberians in Asia. The leadership will keep up with the Embassy as we prepare for the Union's 20th anniversary and Annual conference scheduled for July 2026. The meeting reaffirmed the Union's commitment to fostering stronger ties with the Embassy and Liberian students across China.



THE AFRICAN STUDENTS' CONFEDERATION IN CHINA (ASCC) WAS OFFICIALLY LAUNCHED

Over 100 African student leaders, scholars, and embassy representatives gathered in Beijing on May 30, 2026, for the International Conference of African Students' Associations in China, marking the official launch of the African Students' Confederation in China (ASCC). The event echoed the spirit of the 1960s when visionary leaders like Kwame Nkrumah and Haile Selassie gathered in Addis Ababa to birth the Organization of African Unity. Attendees called for unity beyond national governments, beginning among students themselves. The LSUIC National President served as a topic presenter and panelist,

discussing "African Students as Bridges of Africa-China Cooperation." During the inaugural formation, LSUIC was appointed to two strategic positions: Deputy Secretary of ASCC and Chair of the Academic Committee. The Leaders emphasized that unity grows from classrooms and cultural festivals across Chinese cities. The appointments, announced during the ASCC inaugural conference on May 30, 2026, reflect LSUIC's growing influence among African student bodies across China. "These are not titles. They are responsibilities," the LSUIC National President stated.

On May 31, the National President had the privilege of attending the China Agricultural University Cultural Festival, a vibrant celebration of global diversity. THE NEC PRESENTS AN EMPOWERMENT SESSION TAILORED FOR YOUNG LADIES.



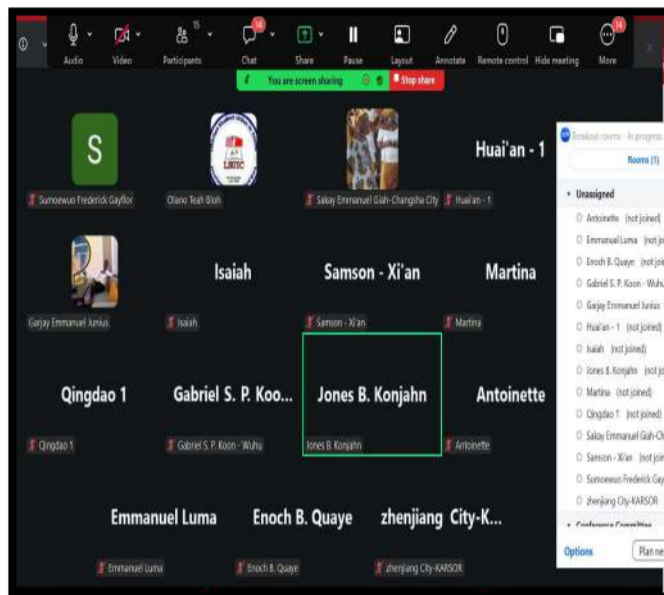
The National Executive Committee (NEC) of the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) has announced a virtual empowerment session for young Liberian ladies studying in and out of the country, scheduled for Friday, June 5, 2026, at 8:00 PM on the LSUIC Zoom platform. Led by National Vice President Hon. Ruphine M. Harmon, the session titled “LSUIC Ladies Empowerment Session” will tackle three critical topics: navigating life, cultural differences, and academic pressure in China; recognizing

transactional traps disguised as love; and fostering “sister keeper” values, mutual accountability, protection, and support among female students. “Your mission in China is too important to walk alone. Join the circle. Guard your light,” the leadership urged. The initiative reflects LSUIC’s broader commitment to student welfare beyond academics, following recent developments with partner Unions/Associations, participation is free and open to all Liberian and non-Liberian female Students.

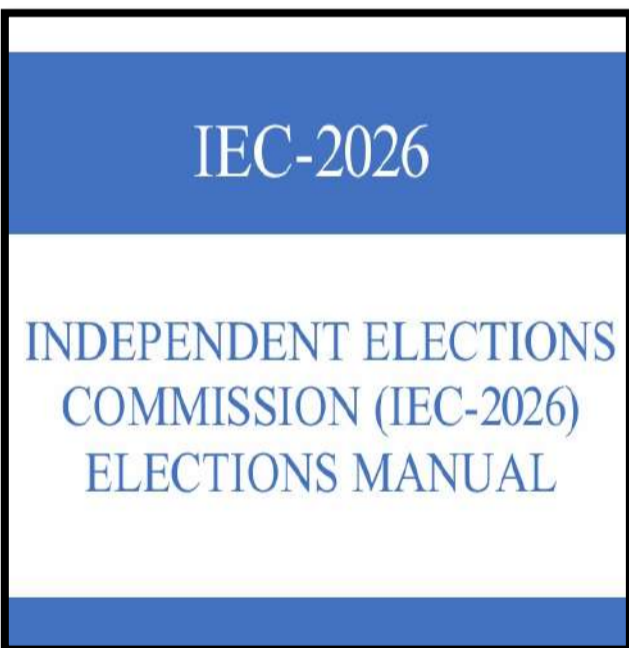
LSUIC CITY PRESIDENTS MEET TO REVIEW CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS, CONFERENCE PLANS ...

The National President, Hon. Olano Teah Bloh, and City Presidents met on May 28, 2026, to discuss the ongoing constitutional amendments with a focus on the proposed Council of Presidents (CoP, Article 19). Some city presidents, including Hon. Isaiah of Yichang City, expressed concerns that though the framework is welcoming and promotes good governance, the changes may overwhelm students if not carefully considered. There were also discussions on the

upcoming annual conference (Jinan City). During the meeting, City presidents provided city-level updates. The National President urged all cities to conduct elections before the annual conference. Leaders were also encouraged to add new students to the LSUIC 2025-2026 groups. They were reminded to start preparing their annual reports. The meeting underscored LSUIC’s commitment to smooth leadership transitions and improved student welfare.



THE IEC HAS RELEASED THE 2026 ELECTORAL GUIDELINE



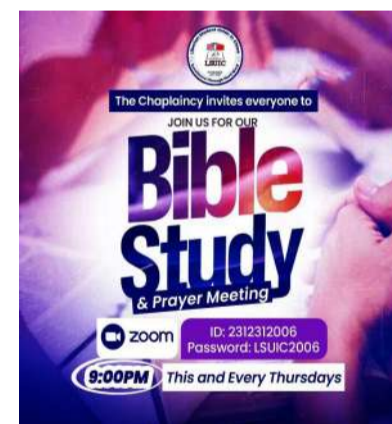
The Independent Elections Commission (IEC) of the Liberian Student Union in China has released the 2026 Elections Manual, which features significant reductions in registration fees for contested positions. Under the new guidelines, presidential aspirants will pay 500 RMB, down from the previous 750 RMB fees, while the National Chaplain General = 97 RMB, the National Secretary General = 350 RMB, the National Deputy Secretary General = 325 RMB, the National Financial Secretary = 300 RMB, and the Nation-

al Treasurer = 300 RMB, with city presidents paying just 50 RMB. “Reduction is prioritized over increment,” aiming to lower financial barriers and encourage broader participation among Liberian students across China. The manual also introduces stricter compliance enforcement and a clear electoral timeline running from June 1 to July 26. Campaigning is permitted from June 20 to July 20, with election day set for July 25 during the union’s annual conference. All fees are non-refundable.

The NEC is continuing the work on the new digital achieve platform

The NEC is continuing development of the new digital archive system. This aims to preserve institutional memory and promote good governance. The initiative is critical, especially due to the constitutional turnover process in Article 36 (Handing Over and Return of the Union’s Assets). The Union has lacked a functional records-keeping system or archival repository for 19 years. The new platform will ensure leadership continuity and safeguard accurate, historical records for future leaders.
