



## LIBERIAN STUDENT UNIONS SIGN LANDMARK MOU TO STRENGTHEN TIES



In a virtual ceremony held on June 10, 2026, the Liberian Student Union in China (LSUIC) and the Liberia National Students Union (LINSU) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to enhance cooperation between Liberian students in China and those at home. LSUIC National President Hon. Olano Teah Bloh presented a detailed overview of the union’s past three quarters, highlighting digital & membership growth, and academic excellence initiatives. LINSU President Hon. James B. Washington, whose organization serves as the parent

body for all student unions in Liberia, outlined several ongoing initiatives including academic competitions, media training programs, and plans to integrate newly established universities into their organization's activities. The MOU establishes collaboration in academic exchange, cultural diplomacy, leadership development, student welfare, entrepreneurship, and community service. A Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC) comprising representatives from both unions will oversee implementation. Both leaders described the signing as a pivotal step in uniting Liberian students globally.

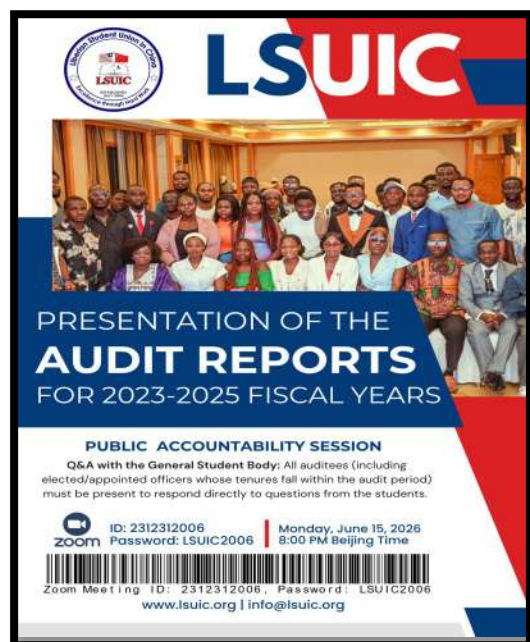
## LSUIC IEC REVIEWS THE UNION'S FIRST DIGITAL VOTING PLATFORM

The IEC has reviewed a new digital voting system for the upcoming LSUIC elections. The Independent Election Commission (IEC) team, through the system presenter Hon. Commissioner Amos Jusu Swaray, demonstrated a platform that requires voters to submit both an admission letter and a good-standing certificate for verification. Council members argued that the dual-document mandate is overly burdensome, particularly for students who have lost their admission

letters or are nearing graduation. The system allows external verification through the National Secretariat, enabling voting once registration is confirmed. Key discussion points included improving user-friendliness and ensuring transparency through a public dashboard that shows real-time results. The council expressed strong support for the IEC online voting to enable good-standing members unable to attend the annual conference to participate.



## PRESENTATION OF THE AUDIT REPORTS (2023-2025) AND PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY SESSION



Following the release of the audit reports for the fiscal years 2023-2025 on June 10 and 11, 2026, the National Executive Committee (NEC), through the office of the National President, Hon. Olano Teah Bloh, has formally invited the Audit Committee to present the reports before the general student body. The public accountability session is set for Monday, June 15, 2026, at 8:00 PM via the LSUIC Zoom platform. The audit covers the leadership tenures of former President Jacob Cephus Johnson. The Audit Committee, chaired

by Mr. Robert Borlay Kaba, is expected to present all findings, discrepancies, and recommendations. All auditees from the 2023-2025 leadership are required to attend a question-and-answer session with students. Hon. Bloh warned that any financial revelations surfacing after the presentation that harm the Union’s reputation or legal standing will be referred to the Judicial Board for prosecution. All LSUIC Members are strongly encouraged to attend, listen, and ask questions.

## THE AEC UNVEILS THE UNION'S FIRST ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARDS PROGRAM

The AEC has released the Academic Excellence Awards guidelines for the 2025–2026 academic year, with winners to be announced on June 27, 2026. The framework, issued by the Academic Excellence Committee (AEC), features three main categories: Best Researchers, Highest GPA, and Best Achieving Scholars, with separate recognition for male and female Students. A standardized scoring system normalizes grades across different Chinese grading

scales. Eligibility extends to all active LSU-IC scholars. First-year and graduating students may receive priority consideration in tie cases. AEC Chairman Christian Mulbah confirmed that two independent reviewers will score each application using published rubrics. Applicants may appeal results within two days of the announcement. A strict conflict-of-interest policy requires recusal for any committee member evaluating relatives or close colleagues..



LSUIC TO HOST VIRTUAL GRADUATION CEREMONY ON JUNE 27,2026 FOR GRADUATING SCHOLARS



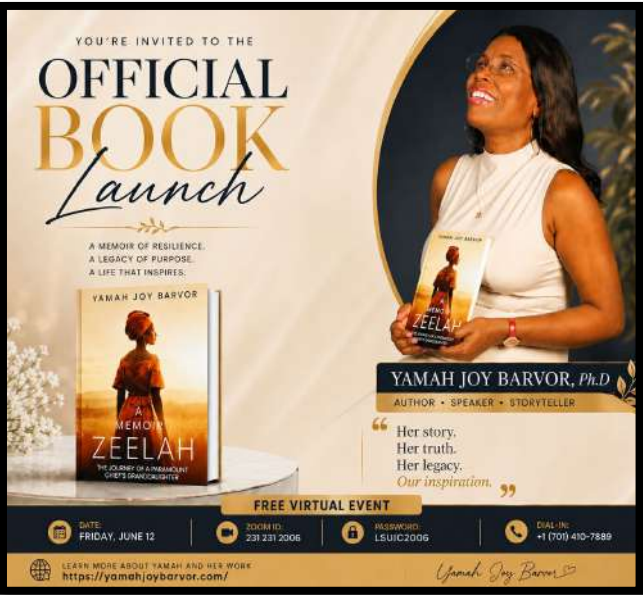
